The following history article was submitted by Pat Stearns in our 2009 Lenten devotional.

Where did the Rev. Valentine Little windows on either side of our altar come from? Were they always in our church?

At my first diaconate meeting in 2000, Barbara Tripp made reference to some stained glass windows. When I asked where they were, she said in the Boy Scout closet in the Thrift Shop. THEY ARE WHERE? So Barbara, Nancy Gardner, and I went down, and sure enough, behind tents, poles, and all manner of Scouting equipment, were our beautiful windows-in great shape.

These windows honor Rev. Valentine Little, first settled pastor in Lovell arriving in 1823. According to Bob Williams, our in house historian, he was a Dartmouth graduate and a remarkable man who built his house on Hatch Hill-later the Halford home, now Prescott's.

In 1850 a Congregational Church was built approximately across from what is now the Center Lovell Market. That is where our stained glass windows were. That church closed in 1942 and the windows were give to John Halford and moved to his Hatch Hill home. According to Barbara Tripp, when the Halfords moved to Severance Lodge Club, the windows were given to our church. Maybe in the 1980's?

So what became of the church by the market? It was sold to Bill Severence for storage for \$500, and the roof collapsed on March 24, 1969.

Back to our window story, the Trustees voted in 2000 to place them In the church, the Cabinet agreed and at a special church meeting after a Sunday service, the project and placement of the windows as approved. On November 11, 2000 the Trustees voted to contact Gary Crowell about installation. At the May, 2001 Diaconate meeting it was reported, "The Memorial Fund was used for the stained glass window installation and painting of the altar area."

P.S. They are a beautiful sight to see when lighted from behind. Join us for worship and see for yourself!
