Dear friends,

The one thing that the church does though, is it comes together every week and for worship and perhaps a cup of coffee or tea after. This provides an opportunity for folks to talk and share face to face (not over some faceless social media!). This isn't to say that we always see "eye to eye" but we are at least given the chance to listen to one another and hopefully reflect on what we heard before coming together next time.
